Class Times and Costs

We offer play-based kindergarten readiness programs for ages 2-5 years old. The child-to-adult ratio is kept low by having participating parents assist the teacher (Koala and Panda class). Stay and Play classes are a Parent/ Child Class.

PRESCHOOL PROGRAMS

<u>Class</u>	<u>Days</u>	<u>Times</u>	<u>Tuition</u>
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*Stay and Play (2-3 years)	T and/or TH	9:30- 11AM	\$100/ Session (1 day/wk)
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Children entering the Stay and Play class must be 2 by the beginning of the session . Class size : 10 maximum/ day

Annual Enrollment fee is \$125

(\$75 of which is non- refundable).

The Enrollment Fee helps cover insurance, field trips, administrative and maintenance costs, etc. for each child.

*KOALAS (3 – 4 years)	W. F	9–11 AM	\$80/mn (Sept- April)
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Children entering the Koala class must be 3 by August 1st .
Class size : 15 maximum

*PANDAS (4-5 years)	M, W, F	12- 2:30PM	\$95/mn (Sept- April)
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Children entering the Panda class must be 4 by August 1st .
Class size: 18 maximum

Koala/ Panda Annual Enrollment fee is \$165

(\$75 of which is non- refundable).

The Enrollment Fee helps cover insurance, field trips, administrative and maintenance costs, etc. for each child. *It also includes \$40 of May's tuition (for Koala and Panda class).*

What is a Co-op Preschool?

Edgewood Preschool Cooperative is a non-profit preschool run by parents, who work closely with qualified teachers to enhance a child's social, emotional, intellectual and physical growth through a safe and appropriate kindergarten readiness learning program.

Developmental Goals for EPC's Children

Social/Emotional

- Develop pro-social behaviors of sharing and cooperation
- Develop awareness of others' feelings
- Develop self control
- Develop problem-solving and decision-making skills

Intellectual

- Develop appropriate language, pre-reading, pre-writing, pre-math and simple science skills
- Stimulate curiosity in learning through discovery, exploration and play
- Encourage creativity, problem-solving and decision-making skills

Physical

- Develop fine motor and large muscle skills

The Co-Op Commitment means:

- Participating in your child's classroom once or twice a month, depending on class size
- Performing one of the many jobs, suited to your interests and available time, that keep the school operating efficiently
- Working and learning together through training sessions, parent support meetings, class meetings and school-wide events.

Participation Fits into Parents' Schedules:

- Parents may request specific dates to participate.
- Mothers and fathers may share the classroom participation responsibility.
- Some parents choose a relative or other caregiver who will consistently participate in their place.
- Babysitting of siblings while a parent participates is often traded with other co-op members.

Health Requirements:

- Participating adults must provide proof of a negative TB test yearly.
- Each child must have a physical exam form completed by the child's physician and have up-to-date immunizations.
